# Priors Hardwick Village Meeting – Thursday 23rd October 2025 at 19.30 in St. Mary the Virgin.

#### Introduction:

The meeting opened at 7:30 pm with thanks expressed to all attendees for coming out on a blustery evening. The Chair reminded everyone that the meeting was being recorded to assist with accurate minute-taking.

# **Summary of Discussion**

#### 1. Minutes of the Previous Meeting

• Previous minutes were approved, with a correction noting that the October meeting began at 7:30 pm (not 7 pm).

#### 2. Matters Arising

- The Chair thanked everyone who helped with the village tidy-up sessions at No Man's Land and around the centre of the village, particularly following recent storm damage.
- The Priors Marston and Priors Hardwick WI will now take over the running of the monthly coffee morning in the Priors hall (first session Tuesday 25 November, 10:30– 12:30).

#### 3. Financial Update - Carolyn Bath

- Several items of village expenditure were reported:
  - £160 spent on a grit box for Hollow Meadow Lane.
  - £500 donations each to Air Ambulance, Myton Hospice, and Katharine House Hospice.
  - £600 donation to the church.
  - £654 spent on a new village gazebo (already hired twice, generating £40 income).

- £680 allocated for village green repairs (thanks to Ann, Eddie and Alan for organising).
- £2,800 set aside for improved heating and lighting at the back of the church.
- £4,000 reserved toward the War Memorial restoration.
- Current balances:
  - Current Account: £3,797General Reserves: £7.925
  - o Fête Reserves (before commitments): £7,388
- £3,956 remains from the **HS2 Action Group** fundraising, held separately for a future community project.

#### 4. War Memorial Restoration - Steve Webb

- Three quotes obtained between £5,700 and £6,600 for stonework, re-lettering, and cleaning.
- Application submitted to the War Memorials Trust; decision expected early 2026.
- The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers and Royal Warwick Yeomanry have pledged £500 each.
- Further funding enquiries made to the MOD Kineton and Warwick School.
- Steve invited villagers to join him at the Royal Warwickshire Museum on 8 November to learn more about those commemorated.

## 5. Planning

- Recent applications limited to routine tree-pruning works.
- The Leys: appeal against Enforcement concerning SAM land was unsuccessful
- Noted that the proposed sale of the Butcher's Arms did not complete.
- The premises is now scheduled for auction on 22 January 2026.
- The Chair has expressed to agents that the village welcomes future engagement with any potential buyer and values the building's heritage and community importance.

#### 6. Councillor Updates - Cllr Nigel Rock

- **Housing Land Supply:** National planning changes may prompt more speculative developments, though impact on Hardwick likely minimal.
- **Gypsy & Traveller Encampments:** Police to hold an information session for local landowners next month in Napton.
- **Fuel Poverty:** Data shows "Ladbroke–Priors" area as among the worst in Warwickshire; older rural homes and oil heating are key factors.
- **Community Policing:** Next mobile police visit expected 6 December in Priors Marston.

#### 7. Parish Meeting vs Parish Council – Discussion

- Prompted by correspondence from Stratford District Council inviting consideration of becoming a parish council.
- Richard Cutt, Christopher Hodgson, Derrin James, and Natalie Bull all spoke in favour of remaining a Parish Meeting, citing:
  - o Strong attendance and open democracy.
  - o Risks of forming a small, unrepresentative group if a council were created.
  - o Potential legal and insurance liabilities.

- Additional costs and administrative burden.
- Stuart Hyde and Steve Webb asked about perceived advantages of change.
- Cllr Rock and Cllr Gist explained the background: Stratford is reviewing local governance in an area including Radbourne and Stoneton. No external pressure; purely an invitation to review.
- Margaret Clarke asked about costs. Cllr Rock advised setup costs for a contested election could reach £4–5 k; uncontested ~£200.
- After discussion, the meeting voted unanimously to remain a Parish Meeting, while agreeing to review this status periodically.

#### 8. HS2 Update

- Concerns over excessive and misleading signage at crossroads and diversions making local travel confusing.
- Requests for HS2 to repair damaged roads, particularly towards Boddington.
- Cllr Rock reported these issues raised repeatedly at the **Jeremy Wright MP Forum**; HS2 has been criticised for poor communication and delays.
- Encouraged all residents to report issues directly to HS2 to strengthen representation.

### 9. Project Enable - Christopher Hodgson

- Church project (PCC-led with parish meeting support) continues despite setbacks:
  - The chancel window masonry urgently needs work (£50 k estimated).
  - o PCC pursuing phased repairs and faculty permissions.
  - Immediate improvements underway: new infrared heaters and downlighters installed at the rear of the church (funded by fête money).
  - o Aim is to make the space usable year-round for community events.

#### 10. Website & Podcast Update – Jenny and Tim Hoban

- Village Voices Podcast: 12 episodes recorded featuring local stories and interviews. Recent editions include Carolyn & Alex's spooky tale, with upcoming features on local farming and village childhoods.
- Website:
  - A spike in overseas visits followed Carolyn's "SAM PDF" going viral in the US (500 downloads).
  - o Around 3,000 visitors per month (half from UK).
  - New online gazebo booking form, village marketplace, and automated grass-cutting rota all now live.
  - Archive updates planned before Christmas.
- A fridge has been donated for gazebo and event use (thanks to John Eustace).

## 11. Priors Sports & Social Club

The club has new trustees and seeks a Hardwick representative to attend two
meetings per year. Volunteers to contact Jane Richards or the Chair.

#### 12. Any Other Business

- **Progressive Supper (Natalie Bull):** 17 January 2026. Villagers will rotate between homes for starter, main, and dessert a fun way to socialise and meet new neighbours.
- Around 16 people already signed up; more participants encouraged.
